From the roll top desk of Pastor Patrick:

Since moving to Grays Harbor I have made many different life changes. I have had to work really hard on focus and concentration. I love to read books about dragons and far off places. I enjoy history and westerns as well. I also like to play sports and be out doors, there is without a doubt a new way to find balance and focus while living in a rain forest in the pacific northwest. I miss golf, and my shooting sports because concentration is part of that game. So I have had to make lots of trades.

In his essay R. R. Tolkien writes about the reasons why people are drawn to fairy tales. Such stories are often at the opposite end of the emotional spectrum to our daily news: instead of war, financial chaos, pandemic, and domestic violence, fairy tales offer happy endings that reflect the longings of the human heart. Tolkien suggests that at the root of those longings is an ache for Christ to set the world right to unite all things, restore all things, and make the world as perfect and beautiful as it was before the fall. Don't you want God to fix it all? Don't you long for the happy ending? Like, right now? Lord, there has to be a better way to live than this right?

Throughout scripture, as through our lives, are reminders that we are not there yet, we hear the same cry for help. Still, we live in a fallen world, burdened with alienation, frustration, and disintegration. Adam sinned, and death and chaos followed. But Jesus came to undo what Adam had done and to accomplish what no one else could. God will fix it all. In fact, He has already begun to.

Throughout his letters to the first century churches, Paul recognized their hardships and never downplayed them; but he also always reminded his readers that there would be a day when sufferings cease and sorrows die, and all our longings are satisfied. [I] He encouraged them to keep their eyes on what was essential to help them deal with the immediate challenges.

What they needed then is what we need now. If you focus only on what you see right in front of you and neglect to allow God's promise of restoration to enter your vision, you won't actually be able to deal with the issues you face. They will grow out of perspective. They will come to dominate. They will drain you of hope and happiness. Even if the problems are global, national, or personal, the best strategy is to keep your eyes on what God's word says about God's plan. There will be a happy ending. There will be a time when all things are united under a perfect King.

What is troubling you today? Change your gaze and focus on a new target, Jesus. Bring an eternal perspective to the affairs of time, with the help of the Spirit, and you can find security in His perfect plan. You can't yet know all the details of the story of this world, but you can know that for those who trust in Christ, the final scene is a happy, endless ending.
