### From the roll top desk of Pastor Patrick:

Ephesians 4:4-6

There is one body and one Spirit just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call one Lord, one faith, one baptism, 6 one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

I was snooping through files the other day and found an old bulletin which read, "United Presbyterian Church." Then one that read, "First Presbyterian Church." Then another that read, "Community Presbyterian Church." I sat and wondered, who are we?

As we continue through Ephesians and consider the impact of true joy in our lives, as we encounter trying times, I want everyone to remember who we are and that we are called to "One hope." This one hope comes only from God and should be the source of our joy in life. This is what the Christian church was tasked with delivering to all the world.

The Reformers insisted that they were not trying to invent a new doctrine, or a new way of doing church, rather they wanted to recover the faith entrusted to the church and confessed since the beginning. They wanted the old ways to return to some degree. Think about this for a minute. The Reformation church did not cast aside the ancient church's understanding of itself but rather maintained it. Proof of this is evident in that the Reformers maintaining belief in the unifying creeds, including the Apostles' Creed. This creed confesses belief in "one holy catholic and apostolic church," giving us four truths about the church of Christ: its unity, its holiness, its catholicity, and its Apostolicity.

Today consider church unity. I kind of like the idea of a "United" presbyterian church so, let's decide to be a united church, simply put, there is only one church of Christ. Despite the institutional and denominational diversity of the visible church, the true church of Jesus Christ consists of one body. Paul teaches us this truth in Ephesians (Eph. 4:4–6).

In Paul's day, there were many individual and distinct churches, each with its own personality. The church in Corinth was not precisely the church in Ephesus, which was not identical to the church in Philippi or in Galatia. Thus, when Paul refers to the oneness of the church, he must be referring to something that transcends subjective expressions of the visible church. He is referring primarily to the one invisible church, the universal church that is made up of everyone who is united to Christ by faith. Local churches may vary in their visible expression, but the church is finally and invisibly one.

It is united in faith (v. 5), that is, truth – biblical and theological. Doctrinal differences are real and should not be ignored, but there is a core faith defined by the gospel that unites all Christians regardless of where they hold their church membership. Do we behave like this in our belief and attitudes?

John Calvin comments on this passage:

"Christ cannot be divided. Faith cannot be rent. There are not various baptisms, but one which is common to all. God cannot cease to be one, and unchangeable. It cannot but be our duty to cherish holy unity, which is bound by so many ties. Faith, and baptism, and God the Father, and Christ, ought to unite us, so as almost to become one man."

Differences between believers remain, but because of the oneness of the true church, we cannot fail to recognize as Christians those who profess the biblical gospel, for when we do so, we deny the reality of the one, invisible church that transcends our local assemblies.

With that said, I know who we are; we are a united presbyterian church in Montesano, WA. Thanks be to God.

Matthew 7:7-8 "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find, knock, and it shall be opened unto you: For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened."

This passage makes it seem so simple! Ask God for what you want and you will get it; look for it and you will find it; just knock and doors will be opened to you. However, Jesus reminds us that God is a good father and will not give us what is wrong for us! When you were young, did you ever ask your parents for something that was just not right for you? Perhaps your children have done the same to you. You don't give a baby a steak, nor do you give a toddler a 10 speed bicycle. You wouldn't let your children look for milk in the cabinet where you keep your cleaning supplies. But sometimes we are looking for what we think we need in all the wrong places. Yes, Jesus tells us to keep asking for what we need and we shall receive it, but he also expects that we will be asking for the right things. We are bombarded with ads that tell us what we need to do or own in order to be happy, but are those truly what we need? Jesus tells us that we need hearts that are open to others, that we must be people of peace and forgiveness, and when we ask for the gift of the Holy Spirit, we will surely receive. When we pray, do we ask God to give us those things which He knows we need to be happy or do we ask for what the media says we need? If we leave the decisions up to God, then we will always receive what we ask for; we will find what we are looking for; and doors will open at our knock.

Gracious God, help us to know what things to ask for that will lead us to know of your glory. Amen
