From the roll top desk of Pastor Patrick:

Lent begins March the 2nd and continues for six weeks into April. Lent is the season of Christian faith where we look at our lives and renew our spirits with discipline. It's not meant to be ritualistic or full of strange ceremony. The days are supposed to be healing and contemplative. A time of prayer, reading Scripture and sharing our faith. We are not to expect massive changes or miracles but we do hope for changes. We pray for the needs of others and for ourselves; remembering that everyone has room to grow. Lent, like springtime, is a time for new growth and life that comes after the snows have thawed and the sun breaks forth to bring the flowers of the season.

I was given a devotional book, <u>The Valley of Vision: A Collection of Puritan Prayers</u>. Puritanism, was a religious reform movement in the late 17th century that sought to change or "purify" the Church of England of remnants of the Roman Catholic that the practices Puritans claimed had been retained by Queen Elizabeth I. Puritans became noted in the 17th century for a spirit of moral and religious earnestness that informed their whole way of life, and they sought through church reform, to make their lifestyle the pattern for the whole nation. Their efforts to transform the nation contributed both to civil war in England and to the founding of colonies in America as working models of the Puritan way of life.

The strength of Puritan character and life lay in prayer and meditation. In this practice the spirit of prayer was of first importance and the best form of prayer, for living prayer is the characteristic of genuine spirituality. Yet prayer is also vocal and is therefore written. I write prayers because I get nervous and my dyslexic mind will actually speak the last word first and first word last.

The Valley of Vision is full of written prayers and meditations which constitute a treasure filled body of inspiring devotional readings. Stan Hall, a seminary professor of mine who passed a few years ago, would agree that too often "off-the-cuff" prayers lack variety, order and conviction. We just get caught up in emotion or tongue tied and we forget what to say. But he would also tell me to allow the Spirit to lead you in every prayer you offer. Just be present and thoughtful. It is here that care and scriptural memory or even "psalter word sharing" can be used. I will read a Psalm or two and the Lord will share words that others need to hear and have applied to our time of prayer.

Here is the Isaiah 22 Valley of Vision prayer.

Dependence on God

Let me learn by paradox
that the way down is the way up,
that to be low is to be high,
that the broken heart is the healed heart,
that the contrite spirit is the rejoicing spirit,
that the repenting soul is the victorious soul,

that to have nothing is to possess all, that to bear the cross is to wear the crown, that to give is to receive, that the valley is the place of vision.

Luke 6:27-28 "But I say unto you which hear, love your enemies, do good to them which hate you, bless them that curse you, and pray for them which despitefully use you."

There are times when the gospel message doesn't fit into our way of thinking, and this is one of them. How are we expected to "love our enemies?" Jesus offers us an answer when he tells us to pray for them. So often we think of love as just an emotion, something we have no control over. While it is true that we can't always control our feelings, we can control our actions, and love is a function of the will, not the heart. We are not expected to have gushy feelings for those who attack us, our country, our way of life, the people we love, but we are expected not to take action against them. If we do, are we just as wrong as they are? I have always found it ironic, that people use violence to bring about peace. IT DOESN'T WORK!

Martin Luther King, Gandhi, Jesus, did not resort to violence. Do we realize that our enemies are still God's children loved by him just as we are? God does not want us to hate, but to love. Prayer is a very powerful force. All we need to do is look at the changes brought about over the years by constant prayer. At Fatima, Mary promised that Russia would return to her and her son if we prayed. It may not have happened as quickly as those of us who can barely wait for water to boil would have liked, but it happened. Change doesn't happen overnight, but is does happen – one loving heart at a time. We can begin with our words and move on to our actions. Words of prayer and love can open the stoniest of hearts. As the song says, "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me."

Lord it is not always easy to love those that hurt us, or whose ideas we disagree with, but this is what God asks of us. Love is the only thing that can make enemies friends, help me to fill my life with friends. Amen
