From the Roll Top - Patrick Cobb

Listen to the words of Jesus from John 14: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there you may be also."

Listen to the words of the angels as they address the men of Galilee in Acts Ch. 1: "Why do you stand there gazing up into heaven?"

By the way, these are words that need to be heralded from the rooftops to all the crystal-ball gazers of the world and to all the institutions that are still navel gazing at the losses of 2021 and COVID World. "Why do you stand there gazing up into heaven?" Why are you stuck, frozen in time, looking back and asking, "What happened?" I didn't order this for dinner! Who did this to me?

It's a legitimate feeling we all have faced. But it's done! The implication is, "Don't we have work to do? I mean, did the Lord Jesus say, "Stand and gaze up into heaven?-no, he didn't. He said, "Go and make disciples of all nations." Bad things are still going to happen (wars, famines, disease) but we are overcomers. We believe in what Jesus did on the cross. And if we're making disciples of all nations, we don't have time to stand around gazing into heaven. "Why do you stand there gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come again in the same way that you have seen him go." This is our Advent message. This is the hope and the work we are called to do. The King of King's and Lord of Lord's is on his way.

Hebrews has been a blessed book to study this year. Turn to Hebrews 9:28, it says: He, Jesus, "will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him." This is an active waiting. Not a passive waiting. The New Testament literally moves with this great assurance, which is a vital part of the Christian gospel. It is as vital an aspect of the message of Christmas as is the cradle in Bethlehem. Do we realize

that? Because if Jesus Christ is not coming back again, then one in four verses in the New Testament is misrepresented; the angels were wrong, and Jesus was misguided in his statement in John 14. You see, the sneaking suspicion has got into the minds of many that he's not coming back again, people have lost hope. The result is, therefore, humanity won't have to face him. In the words of Harold "OH BOY! - That's bad theology. But as surely as he came to Bethlehem, he will come back in glory. So, ask yourself:

Why did Jesus come? To make the Father known. Do you know the father? Yes, you do. So, live into it.

Why did Jesus come? To defeat Satan's works. Are you living in the light of that victory? Do you seek justice, love mercy and walk humbly with Jesus?

Why did Jesus come? To take away our sins. "Have you knelt at the cross? Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? Are you grateful?

I hope that these thoughts are helpful in bringing some to faith, renewing others in our love for Jesus, and giving us another little glimpse of the fact that when we sing the Christmas carols, we are touching upon the great realities of our Christian faith, and that we may worship him even better this year than we've ever done before. Advent is coming. Jesus is coming. Christmas is coming. Behold a child, a King!


