# From the roll top desk of Pastor Patrick

Romans 3:31 But by shifting our focus from what we do to what God does, don't we cancel out all our careful keeping of the rules and ways God commanded? Not at all. What happens, in fact, is that by putting that entire way of life in its proper place, we confirm it.

Why is it so hard to get my house in order? I try and try to do things that better the home. I paint in the summer, I replace rotted wood, I fix leaking faucets and I check for problems hoping to catch them before they turn to real trouble. But it still leaks. Wood gets old and paint fades and peels. I just want to have a happy home. Is that too much to ask?

When we are adopted into the Oikos family, when we open the door to Christ and He comes in and cleans up our house, the law closes one door and a new one is opened; so, one is under a new rule and a new covenant. MPC, you are God's children; it is your first duty to obey your heavenly Father and it is your responsibility to participate in the housework for the home in which you now live. You live in a new home! Clearly, it's not that easy or straight forward.

And that's ok. But your first duty is to love, then to serve, then to love some more. House rules!

Spurgeon says, "A servile spirit you have nothing to do with: You are not a slave but a child. And now, inasmuch as you are a beloved child, you are bound to obey your Father's faintest wish, the least intimation of His will. Does He bid you fulfill a sacred ordinance? It is at your peril that you neglect it, for you will be disobeying your Father."

How does God want you to love in this house? How does he want you to work his fields? Does He command you to seek the image of Jesus? Is it not your joy to do so? Does Jesus tell you, "You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect"? Then not because the law commands, but because your Savior enjoins, you will labor to be perfect in holiness. Does He bid his saints to love one another? Do it, not because the law says, "Love your neighbor," but because Jesus says, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

And this is the commandment that He has given to you, "that you love one another." Are you told to distribute to the poor? Do it, not because charity is a burden that you dare not shirk, but because Jesus teaches, "Give to him that asks of you." Does the Word say, "Love God with all your heart"? Look at the commandment and reply, "Ah, commandment, Christ has fulfilled you already. I have no need, therefore, to fulfill you for my salvation, but I rejoice to yield obedience to you because God is my Father now, and He has a claim upon me, which I would not dispute."

May the Holy Ghost make your heart obedient to the constraining power of Christ's love, that your prayer may be, "I will run in the way of your commandments when you enlarge my heart!" Grace is the mother and nurse of holiness, and not the apologist of sin. Only then will your house become a home and you will see the transformation as it takes place in each and every new day. Love this home, leaks, old wood, and all. For it loved you first.

In Sunday School on January 14, we studied Hannah Whitall Smith's Recovering the Joy of Service. The soul finds itself saying, instead of the 'May I?' of love, the "Must I?' of duty...It is altogether the way we look at things whether we think they are crosses or not.

And I am ashamed to think that any Christian should ever put on a long face and shed tears over doing a thing for Christ which a worldly person would be only too glad to do for money...Now, from all these forms of bondage the soul that enters fully into the blessed life of faith is entirely delivered. In the first place, service of any sort becomes delightful to it,... What you need to do, then, dear Christian if you are in bondage in the matter of service, is to put your will completely into the hands of your Lord, surrendering Him the entire control of it... Many Christians...love God's will in the abstract, but carry great burdens in connection with it. From this there is also deliverance in the wonderful life of faith. For in this way of life no burdens are carried, no anxieties felt. The Lord is our burden carrier."
