From barracks at Fort Hood....

2 Chronicles 5:13 For the glory of the Lord was displayed, "For He is good and his steadfast love endures forever."

2 Corinthians 5:21 For our sake he made him to be sin, who knew no sin. So that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

It's funny how easy it is to neglect habits and disciplines that are really good for you and regress into behaviors and habits that may not be bad, but definitely are not beneficial. Say for instances, getting up early and reading your Bible, exercising and filling your day with basic duties. This is what Army life instills and one weekend a month doesn't really do for me if you know what I mean. Over the past four years I have allowed my early morning routine to morph into something very different. Not bad or wrong, just different.

This morning, I was reminded of Solomon's big day. The day he brought the Ark of the Covenant back to Israel and into the house of the Lord to reside permanently as a place of worship for all God's people. Solomon had to gather all the elders and priests, retrain them, rebuild, clean, organize and plan and prepare

everything perfectly. I forget who says this, but it goes something like this, "Prior planning prevents piss poor performance." And Solomon knew all this too well. He had learned it from his father, and King David's mistakes. So, he didn't want his project to become something that didn't glorify the Lord.

We bug out tomorrow, June 19 at 5:00 P.M. We will fly for 14 hours with two stops until we arrive at our destination, where we will begin our 9-month mission to care for and heal the sick and wounded. An honorable calling. I hope I am ready. The 2 Corinthians passage reminded me that even in all my preparation and training, time itself causes us to be tarnished from our original quality or abilities. It's like the silver forks and knives in my dining room at home. My mom gave us a stunning set of silverware, which had never been polished in quite some time. I could spend hours rubbing each piece to make it shine with beauty; this would take days. I could be diligent every day, making the effort to clean, a good endeavor for sure, but still tedious. Thankfully, Jesus makes things right in one fell swoop. Did you know that if you take aluminum foil and a little dish soap, put

them in a bowl, place the silver in and let it sit, after an hour the tarnish leaves the silver and sets on the foil? I don't know why. But in the same way our tarnished lives, our sin, our brokenness, our failures and our faults transfer to Jesus, and he bears our dirtiness on the cross and makes us shine before the Lord. Thanks be to God.

It seems too good to be true, to easy right? We keep scrubbing and pushing and pulling trying to make ourselves right before the Lord. But no planning or preparation can do what Jesus does out of love and pure grace. And that is OK! Rest in the waters of baptism knowing who you are and what you have been called to do. We are to shine in the glory of the gospel displayed in us for Him who bears the sins of the world. This really is the best way to live. Peace be with you all.

In the adult Sunday School, we have been reading and studying devotionals from a variety of great Christian writers. The following excerpt from John Wesley provides excellent guidance for our church family in the upcoming months.

"Beware of schism, of making a tear in the Church of Christ. Ceasing to have a reciprocal love for one another, is inner disunity which is at the very root of outward separation. Beware of everything which leads to this separation. Beware of a dividing spirit..... Do not despise or run down any preacher. Do not exalt anyone above the rest lest you hurt him and the cause of God. Do not bear hard upon any preacher because of some inconsistency or inaccuracy of expression; no, not even for some mistake, even if you are right. Do not even give a single thought of separating from your brethren, whether their opinions agree with yours or not. Just because someone does not agree with everything you say does not mean that they are sinning. Nor is this or that opinion essential to the work of God. Be patient with those who disagree with you. Do not condemn those who do not see things just as you do, or who think it is their duty to contradict you, whether in a great thing or small."

"We should always remember that love is the highest gift of God. All of our revelations and gifts are little things compared to love. There is nothing higher in religion. If you are looking for anything else, you are looking wide of the mark. Settle in your heart that from this moment on you will aim at nothing more than that love described in the thirteenth chapter of 1 Corinthians. You can go no higher than this."

1 Corinthians 13: 1-8 1 If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. 4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 8 Love never fails...

So let us show love and grace to one another and our pastors as we build each other up and prosper during the coming coming months.
