I decided to read a few classics while I am deployed in Germany. The first was, For Whom the Bell Tolls, by E. Hemmingway. The second was East of Eden, by J. Steinbeck.

East of Eden provides Christian readers with much food for thought but it isn't a 'Christian' novel by any stretch of the imagination. In fact, I was embarrassed and ashamed of reading Chapters 20 and 32. Skip those chapters or get the CliffsNotes. Still, Steinbeck uses themes and stories from the Bible in his fiction, but that doesn't mean how he uses them is biblical. He has characters who you root for as faithful hopefuls, only to be disappointed down the line. The novel is about parents and sons, good and evil, nature versus nurture, and a tricky and deceptive idea called free will. It poses the questions, "Do we have the ability to master sin and choose good?" Or "Are we doomed to be mastered by sin, fated to keep repeating the same mistakes over and over, and burdened down by shame and guilt?" The central biblical theme is the story of Cain and Abel. First, the story is read aloud from the Bible by Adam, the main character, his buddy Tom and the ranch hand Lee, who is Chinese and a self-professed Presbyterian. Then the story is discussed between the men to analyze life.

The critical verse is Gen. 4:7 and the Hebrew word, Timshel, is uttered at several key places most significantly at the conclusion of the novel. Steinbeck's main point in the novel is that man has free will, but he won't master sin; therein lies the problem. The characters conclude that because the choice is his--it is not determined by his genes or by fate or by God--there is hope for the future. So, where does that leave the reader, especially if they are a Christian, a young Christian?

Turn to Romans 11:33 – Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God. How unsearchable are His Judgments and His ways past finding out! For who has known the ways of the LORD? Or who has become his counselor? Or who has first given to Him and it shall be repaid of him?

The characters of East of Eden do not know the riches of God or pursue his wisdom. They have only received information from a story in the Bible. They do not seek the will or the mind of the Lord. Pay attention to Paul's use of the word LORD. This is Yahweh. And it means there is a relationship present with the seeker and the Lord of Hosts, and the King of Kings.

When we seek a relationship with the Lord, like Paul, we will draw from the sovereign expression of grace and faith in the ONE who offers it first to those whom he calls children. They will respond and the relationship begins. So, to affirm scripture with scripture, Paul says, "So then it is not of him who wills, nor of him who runs, but of God who shows mercy." Rom. 9:16.

Rest faithfully in the mercy and grace of the Lord our God and He will show you his plan for your life.


