Matthew 16:16-19

Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

Romans 3:10-12 "There is no one righteous, not even one; there is no one who understands; there is no one who seeks God. All have turned away, they have together become worthless; there is no one who does good, not even one"

How do we expand the kingdom? How do we let loose the Christian faith of Christ around us? How do we get people to want to attend church? How do we introduce our friends and coworkers to faith in Christ and the benevolence of a loving living God who wants a relationship with us? As I ask myself these questions regularly, I imagine Frodo and Gandalf sitting in the caves of Moria; Frodo, being burdened by the ring, begins to lose

hope. I wonder, is there hope for our people when it seems we have all gone astray and no one is worthy, not even one.

We are all born with the same illness - Sin. Love for God and affection for Christ are not natural to us. Before we can love God, something must happen to us. Our hearts of stone must be changed into hearts of flesh, hearts that beat with new life and true affection for God. When one speaks of being "born again," he is speaking of his or her change of heart. But why are our hearts so hard?

When God quickens us from spiritual death, when He regenerates us by His Holy Spirit, He does heart surgery on us. He turns the stone into living tissue; converted to gain a new character, a new attitude, and a new heart. When once we were hostile, cold, or indifferent to God, now we are warmly attracted to Him. Our souls are awakened to love. We are even given a blood transfusion.

To be a Christian is to be a new person. We have undergone a transformation that is rooted in the heart.

The more we know God, the greater our capacity to love Him. The more we love Him,

the greater our capacity to obey Him. Our new affection, however, must grow, it must be nurtured, and it must be maintained through the keys of the kingdom which unlock the faith within our lives. What are the Keys of the Kingdom? (Please look this up. Think of it as homework).

We are called to love God with our whole hearts. The new heart of flesh must be nurtured. It must be fed by the Word of God. If we neglect our new hearts, they too can undergo a hardening, yes, even more than once or twice. Thankfully, if we are within a body that is tightly knit, and strong, we will not revert to a total heart of stone, but it can get a bit crusty.

Still, the new heart is the re-creation of the Holy Spirit. That same Holy Spirit is working within us to bear His fruit. As our hearts are more inclined to God, so the fruit of His Spirit is multiplied in our lives.

Sanctification is a matter of the heart. The keys to the kingdom are what will allow us to build this church, if we take it with the utmost seriousness as a process that flows from intimate fellowship with God. Jesus summarized the matter by showing the link between love and law: "If you love Me, keep My commandments."
