FROM THE ROLL TOP DESK OF PASTOR PATRICK...

Luke 22:39-46: Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. On reaching the place, he said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation." He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground. When he rose from prayer and went back to the disciples, he found them asleep, exhausted from sorrow. "Why are you sleeping?" he asked them. "Get up and pray so that you will not fall into temptation."

What was in the cup?

While in Germany I read a slew of classics, mostly Hemmingway. I read Kipling's, Kim. And I read Steinbeck's, East of Eden. East of Eden was pretty dark and depressing, much like the story of the Joad family in The Grapes of Wrath. Yet, I thought and imagined what it was like to trek west. I asked myself, what drove people west? Early in American history it was riches: a gold rush, exploration, adventure, free land and want. Some fled the

law. Some would flee the Civil War. Some would be cast out of society due to mental illness, crime, gambling etc... Some wanted only wealth through trapping, hides, meat, and the possession of cattle, horses, wood, and material. When the dust bowl hit people went west to survive, new prospects and a better life. All that aside, two words come to mind, Total Depravity. Not much has changed, has it? Humanity is still a troubled lot. As I read the passage from Luke, I felt the drowsiness of grief and I wondered, what was in that cup?

The spiritual use of "The Cup" in Scripture represents more than meets the eye for our humanity and our relationship with God in Christ. There is judgment, and there is suffering, and there is wrath. Still, there is a cup of blessing that overflows, and there is a cup Jesus turns to wine to represent the best he has to offer. There is a cup we share because we are generous, and we want to be with each other in prosperity. We raise a toast to goodness, and we drink from a cup that is sweet and joyful. So why does Jesus poignantly ask his Father, "If you are willing, take this cup from me but not my will, but yours be done." What was in the cup?

Revelation 14:19 shares the darker imagery of what was in that cup. Jesus did not want to drink of the cup that was before him in the garden of Gethsemane. Why? Oh! Patrick, you say, there is not a real cup, it is a metaphor. Or is it? If there was no real cup to drink from, then why did Jesus sweat drops of blood? Why agonize in prayer in the darkness of a forest away from anyone who could see or hear him? No, there was a cup. And there was an audience that watched as he took the first sip. But what was in the cup? It was a cup of wrath. It was a cursed cup.

And please do not think there is only God's will to be done. That was the heresy of Monothelitism. Yes, two natures, one person, never divided or confused. But Jesus, knows what he will face and what he is about to drink. And he knows he wants none of it. But not his will be done. So, he reaches for the cup.

Luke 22:20 "And after supper he took another cup of wine and said, this is the new covenant in my blood shed for you, do this in remembrance of me." Every time you

come to the table this cup of the new covenant is a way to remember Jesus as he taught his disciples how to follow him, how to be more like him.

At Passover everyone drank four healthy portions from the cup with the idea they may not get anymore and to cherish what they had at that moment. Jesus is the cup they were to be drinking from in that moment. The idea is Jesus is our portion, and he is all we need to sustain our faith. He drank the cup on our behalf that we would receive mercy and grace as he filled our cup with the blessings of faith, hope, and love that lead to salvation.

This is a question I would like you to answer. Here is your mission if you choose to accept it. Share on our Fellowship Hall pin board - What was in the cup? And what is in your cup today? I look forward to reading your thoughts.
